## ORDINANCE NO. 70

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GOLF, FLORIDA, PROVIDING THAT THE VILLAGE OF GOLF SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 101.657, FLORIDA STATUTES, SPECIFICALLY RELATED TO EARLY VOTING; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE, A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE, AND AUTHORITY TO CODIFY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature has adopted revisions to Section 101.657, *Florida Statutes*, which require and regulate early voting; and

WHEREAS, the terms of Section 100.3605, *Florida Statutes*, allow municipalities to exempt themselves from any section of the state elections code unless the section has been made expressly applicable to municipalities; and

WHEREAS, Section 101.657, *Florida Statutes*, relating to early voting, does not state that it expressly applies to municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council of the Village of Golf, Florida, believes it to be in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Village that the Village exempt itself from the early voting provisions of Section 101.657, *Florida Statutes*, requiring and regulating early voting.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GOLF, FLORIDA THAT:

**SECTION 1:** The Village shall be exempt from the provisions of Section 101.657, *Florida Statutes*, regarding early voting, as that section may be amended from time to time.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: The Village Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this ordinance to the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections, 240 South Military Trail, West Palm Beach, Florida 33416.

**SECTION 3:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
